SUMMARY

Mr. Mehta is one of the world's leading authorities, practitioners and researchers on sustainable tourism, ecotourism physical planning and both the landscape architectural and architectural aspects of ecolodges. He is probably the only design professional in the world to be inducted as a **FELLOW** in three different continents - American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA), Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA), England and Architectural Association of Kenya (AAK), Kenya - and in two different professions - Landscape Architecture and Architecture. In 2015, Mr. Mehta was the recipient of *United Nations* (UNEP/GFHS) "Outstanding Achievement Award" for his work with alleviating poverty and protecting sensitive ecosystems. In July 2006, *National Geographic* identified Mr. Mehta as one of five Sustainable Tourism Pioneers in the world.

Mr. Mehta has thirty-four years of work experience, consulted in sixty-five countries (spanning six continents) in the world and is a multi-International award-winning designer with Awards in Landscape Architecture, Planning, Architecture, Urban Design, Creative Writing and Publishing, and Interior Design. Mr. Mehta's firm **HM Design** (which began in Kenya in 1991) is currently working on environmentally and socially friendly projects in Galapagos, Philippines, Mexico, Kenya, and Dominica. He has vast experience in Protected Area Physical Planning and has worked on Sustainable Tourism Plans that protect the last remaining endangered species such as Mountain Gorillas in Rwanda; Tigers in India; Giant Pandas in China; Jaguars in Costa Rica; Galapagos Shark; Bali Starlings etc.

Mr. Mehta regularly conducts research on Ecotourism and Ecolodges and is the author and photographer of the award winning *Authentic Ecolodges* (launched by *Harper Collins* in November 2010). He is currently working on **Authentic Ecolodges-Volume 2**. Mr. Mehta is also the editor of the *International Ecolodge Guidelines* and the co-author of the chapters on "Site Planning" and "Architectural Design". He was the longest serving Board Member of The International Ecotourism Society (sixteen years) and was an on-site inspector for the *National Geographic* Unique Lodges of the World program.

Mr. Mehta has a distinguished history in academia and is currently an Adjunct Professor at Florida International University (FIU), University of International Corporation, Costa Rica and VATEL Hotel and Business School, Madagascar. He has been the External Examiner for the Dept. of Landscape Architecture, Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology, Kenya for five years. He was also the Chairman of Landscape Architecture Section, Department of Architecture, University of Nairobi and conducted studios in sustainable planning and design for five years. Mr. Mehta conducts one-of-a kind Ecoplanning and Design Workshops and Charettes around the world and which are attended by academicians, practitioners etc. Mr. Mehta is a well-sought out speaker and has presented at over 198 Conferences/Seminars/Public lectures/webinars in thirty-six countries across all six continents.

Mr. Mehta is also a *Professional Photographer* and a Hall of Fame / ex- Cricket Captain from Kenya. In July 2005 he was named by *Men's Journal*, a New York based Magazine as the "25 Most Powerful People in Adventure" in the world. He has been featured / interviewed / mentioned in over 196 international magazines, newspapers, books, newsletters and blogs.

HM Design is the lead Consultant, site planner, landscape architect and Design Architect for a new ecoresort located in the eastern part of the island of St. Cristobal, Galapagos. Mr. Mehta is leading a consultant team that is providing FULL Planning and Design services. The master plan includes High-End Villas, Main Reception, Dining and Lounge Building, Six Senses Spa and Fitness Center, Experience Center, Research Center, Meditation and Massage Gazebos, Solar Farm and Battery Storage, Organic Vegetable Garden etc. HM Design prepared a detailed "Landscape as a Visual Resource Analysis" for this project which was one of four projects that won the "Award of Excellence" for the FLASLA 2014 awards. HM Design is currently working on the Design Development package (10/16 to present).

Next stages of the planning and design are under negotiation. (9/20 to present).
- Bweju Beach Ecoresort and Spa, Zanzibar Island, Tanzania. HM Design was a member of a
 Kenya led team for the planning and design proposal of a Boutique Hotel on the eastern Coast
 of Zanzibar Island. The team designed the hotel architecture and gardens to have a strong
 Islamic character and one which is inspired by the Dhows and artifacts of the region. The clients
 have places this project on hold due to covid. (2/20 to 5/20).

The modern, almost minimalist, interiors reflect the clients' worldwide cultural background of three continents. The garden was designed and implemented with the same meticulous approach as the interiors and every single plant species is not only native but selected to attract butterflies, bees or birds. HM Design created a garden that has been certified as a *Wildlife Habitat* by the National Wildlife Federation. All the power needs of the house and garden are supplied by newly installed Solar Panels. This House and Garden is probably the most eco-friendly single-family residence in Florida (8/18 to 5/21).
- Tilicho Home upscaling and COVID Design, Annapurna Circuit, Nepal: Mr. Mehta provided Covid Design consultancy to IFC to help improve the safety and health of guests of seven mountain-based lodges operated by a local Company Tilicho Homes. Mr. Mehta prepared plans and sections that also demonstrated the eco-upgrading of the lodges so as to cater for a more eco-friendly minded clientele. (4/20 6/20).
- Annapurna Conservation Area Consultancy, Nepal. Together with four other consultants (contrcted by IUCN), Mr. Mehta undertook field visits to six protected areas and conducted a series of on-site studies to identify and elaborate tourism concession opportunities for seven selected sites. He provided site analysis and land use sketches and best practice example photos that are compatible with the principles of sustainable design and the park management plans in marine and terrestrial protected areas. Mr. Mehta also supported the Investment Specialist in exploring opportunities for modernization of developments and new developments that could be achieved through partnership with the private sector as part of the protected area concession process. The planned developments will include various types of functional infrastructure such as ecolodges and infrastructure for ecotourism activities in the buffer zone of protected areas (6/19 2/20).

He conducted site assessments of community lands ii) the hot springs site and iii) the visitor information center site. - plans and architectural conceptual designs with the ultimate goal of improving the variety and quality of facilities and attracting new investment to the island. These Conceptual Plans were presented to the various stakeholders and Mr. Mehta revised the drawings (5/19 to 12/19).
- Kwanari Ecolodge, Dominica, West Indies. HM Design is the lead Consultant, concept architect and landscape architect for an ecolodge in the eastern part of the Commonwealth of Dominica. The lodge was to open in the summer of 2018 but was partly destroyed by Hurricane Maria. It will be the first planned and designed ecolodge in Dominica and there are many benefits to the neighboring native Kalinago people. Mr. Mehta is introducing a whole new type of Architecture in the Caribbean called "Forest Caribbean". HM Design and their local team of consultants (including Architect of Record) are providing full services including construction supervision. The master plan includes an ecolodge and wellness center, forest and ocean cabins, tree house, swimming pool, library and trails. This lodge won a 2014 FLASLA 'Planning and Analysis' award (9/15 to present).
- Ecolodge Planning and Design Training Workshops. Mr. Mehta has been conducting Ecotourism Facilities Planning and Design workshops all over the world for over 20 years and currently at Florida International University and International School for Sustainable Tourism, Silang, Philippines. He has previously conducted these workshops for George Washington University and The International Ecotourism Society. These workshops range from 4 hours to 5-days and have taken place in Manila, Silang and Subic Bay, Philippines; Miami, Portland and Hilton Head Island, USA; Puerto Rico and St. John Island, Caribbean: Nairobi and Juja, Kenya; Cyangugu, Rwanda; Missiones, Argentina; Quebec and Montreal, Canada; Dili, Timor Leste; Gangtok, Sikkim and Jim Corbett NP, India; Muscat, Oman; Cairo, Egypt; Blue Ridge Mountains and Alice Springs, Australia; (4/99 to present).
- Antipolo Botanical Gardens, Organic Farm and Lodge, Antipolo, Philippines. HM Design is the site planner and landscape architect for a one-of-a-kind project which combines three (Flor's Garden, Ed's Farm and Carolina Bamboo Garden) existing gardens and farm into one single 'legacy' destination of fifteen hectares. The integrated biodiversity conservation and sustainable tourism master plan, is climate-change friendly and includes the first Botanical Garden (including several themed gardens) in the Philippines, an Organic Farm and Education Center, Café and Restaurant for day visitors, a boutique Green-Lodge and Spa, Bamboo Research Center, Wedding Pavilions, Bamboo Museum and Bridge, Welcome and Visitor Center, Picnic Areas and Restored Forest Trails. HM Design is the site planner and landscape architect for a project where an existing coffee farm (located in the Veracruz area of Mexico) is being converted to a climate-smart Biodynamic Farm, Conservation Community and Ecotourism experience. The Long-Term Physical Plan involved other professionals including scientists and environmentalists. The master plan includes a farm for coffee and edible food, a Café for day visitors, a boutique Ecolodge, a wellness center, a Student Education Center containing dormitory and classrooms, single family lots, Green School and trails. HM Design is currently working on the next stage of the planning process Schematic Design (8/18 to present).

- City Park Conceptual Master Plan, Nairobi, Kenya. HM Design is providing pro-bono master planning services to a grassroots organization- Friends of City Park for the rehabilitation of an iconic 90-yr old urban park located in one of the suburbs of the capital city. HM Design conducted a participatory Planning charette with over 35 stakeholders and began by prepraring a Land Use Plan.
